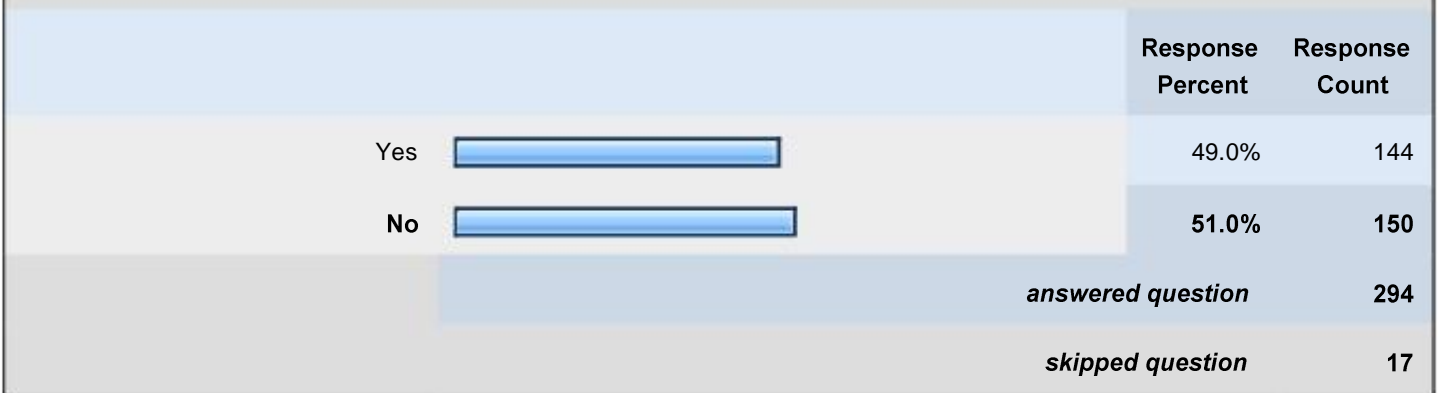

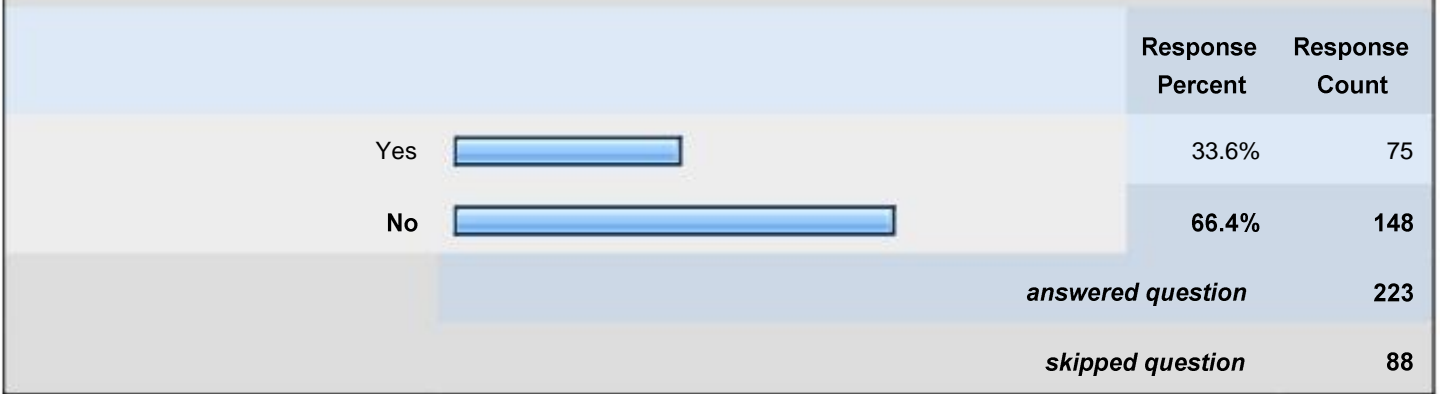

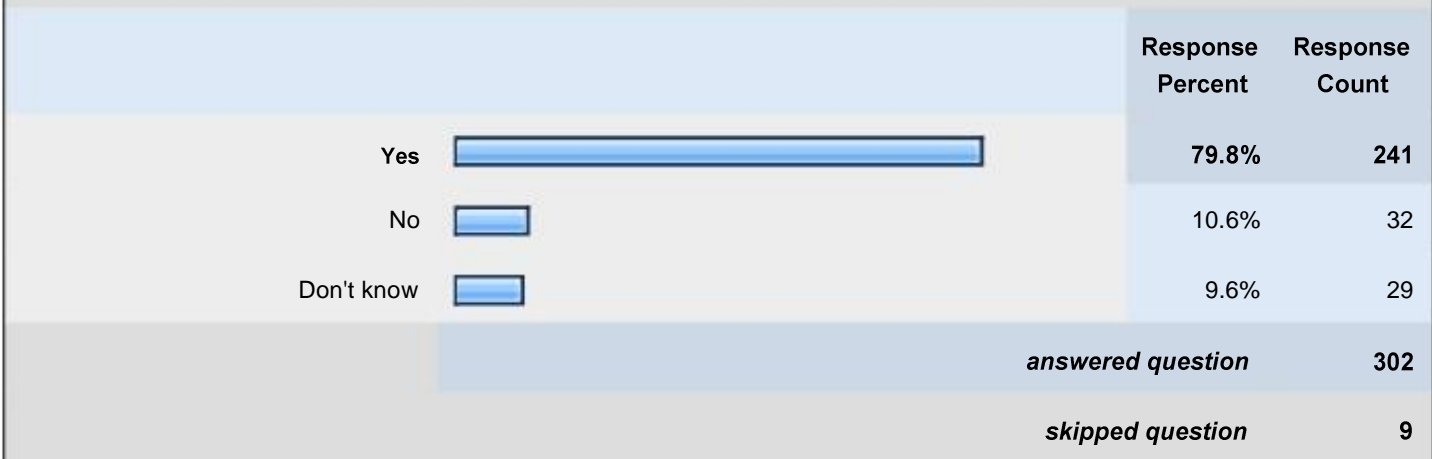
**48. Has Barack Obama's election and presidency led to increased opportunities for blacks in the workplace?**






**49. Has Barack Obama's election and presidency led to increased opportunities for members of nonblack racial- and ethnic-minority groups in the workplace?**






**50. Do you believe Barack Obama's election and presidency has led to a perception *among whites* of increased opportunities for blacks that exceeds the reality of the present situation?**
